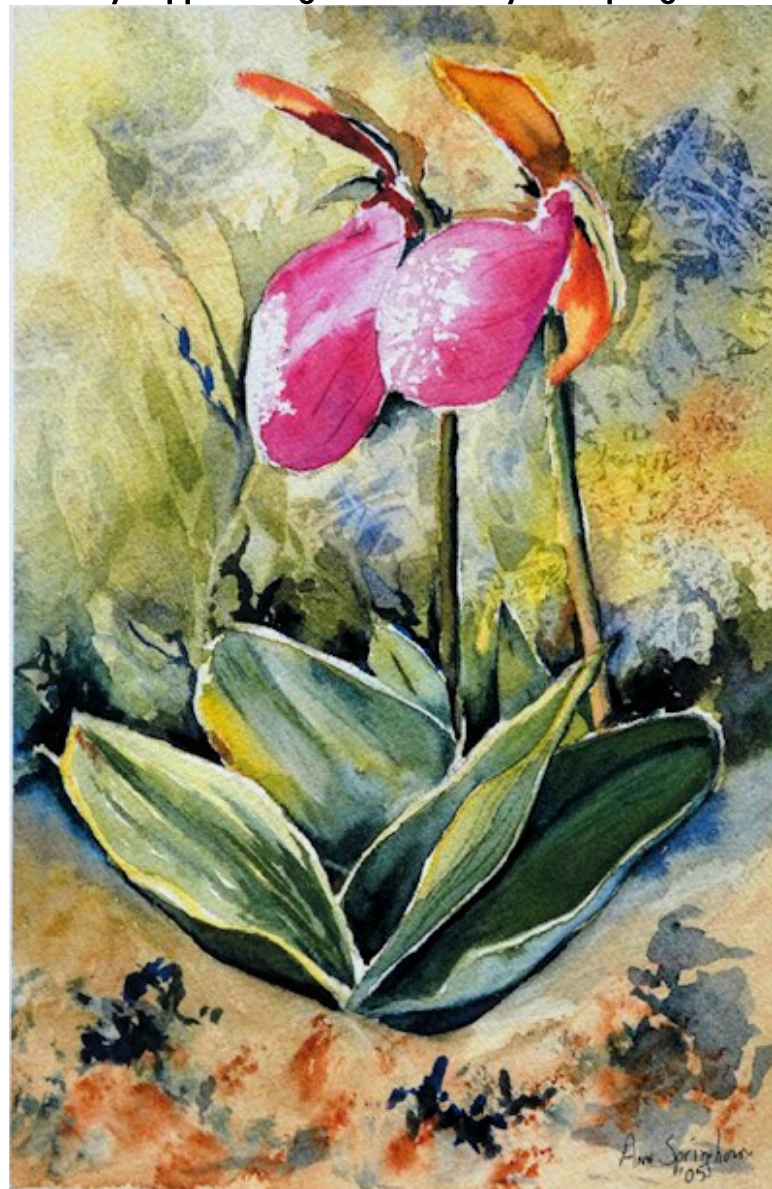

The Great Fire of 1918

Fire at Westport Sweeps the Island - 32 Buildings Lost

Extracted from *The Bath Independent*, Saturday, May 11, 1918

Thirty-two buildings were destroyed by the forest fire that raged over the island town of Westport Wednesday afternoon and night and all day Thursday. The loss is estimated at about \$125,000. Most of the buildings were summer homes but three were occupied dwellings, those of Waldron Pierce and Mrs. Philens Kahail burned Wednesday and the home of George Clancy was destroyed Thursday.

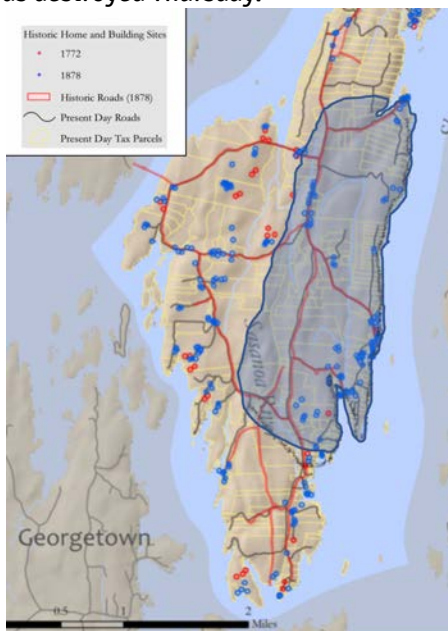
The island is without firefighting apparatus of any sort and help was summoned from Bath, Boothbay Harbor, Wiscasset, Five Islands, Southport, Robinhood, Woolwich and all adjacent communities.

In addition to the houses burned were Hilton's mills and the South school house, built several years ago at a healthy expense. This will be quite a loss to the people in that part of the town as it served a double purpose as a place of meeting and social gatherings.

The fire is said to have broken out near where Morse's portable saw mill men were setting up a mill on the Pike lot about half a mile above Westport Junction on the west side of the island about four o'clock Wednesday afternoon.

The timber on this tract had been cut and was ready to be sawed. It was surrounded by more or less slash and deep undergrowth both of which were exceptionally dry and furnished hot fuel for the flames fanned by a strong northwest gale. Before the fire could be stamped out on the spot where it began, the flames were spreading in all directions and traveling eastward at a rapid pace. The entire town was notified but the fire was beyond the power of human hands to check with no firefighting apparatus at hand. Bucket brigades were formed and, in some cases, they succeeded in saving property but the high wind caused the flames to spread with such rapidity that little could be done to check them.

There are about 125 houses of various types and descriptions on the island and about 300 inhabitants. Every person was called to fight the fire demon and most were busy all night. During Thursday afternoon the flames spread in the area and it was soon seen that the fire was beyond the efforts of the local people to check it.
